Anticipatory Set - A Situational Analysis

Directions: Have students break into groups of 3-4 participants. Give each group one of the following situations to analyze. In their analysis, ask them to answer the following questions:

- What is the issue/problem that needs to be solved?
 - Brainstorm some ways in which the issue/problem could be improved.
 - What kind of qualities does a “leader” in this situation need to possess in order to successfully solve the problem?
 - What would be the differences between the actions of a “good” leader and a “bad” leader in this situation? Provide at least three examples of each.
 - What kind of people are leaders?
1. You are a member of the Associated Student Body (ASB) and you have to organize the junior prom.
 2. You are the captain of the football/volleyball/wrestling or any sports team and you are trying to win the championship.
 3. You are an older sibling and you want to be a good role model for your brothers and/or sisters.
 4. You’ve noticed that there is a lot of trash left around campus after nutrition break and lunch.
 5. You know people who often bully others, and/or you know someone who is continually bullied.
