

THOMAS JEFFERSON: A POLITICAL LEADER

- Author of the Declaration of Independence
- Governor of Virginia
- United States minister to France
- Emerging leader of the Anti-Federalists
- Secretary of State for George Washington
- Vice President to John Adams
- 3rd President of the United States of America (1800)

THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE, JULY 4, 1776

- Authored by Thomas Jefferson
- Document that officially declared America's independence from Great Britain
- "all men are created equal ..."

The unanimous Declaration of the theter united States of Henerica.

SUCCESSES AS PRESIDENT OF THE USA

- Louisiana Purchase (1803)
- Lewis & Clark Expedition
- Elimination of national debt



CHANGING THE ROLE OF THE PRESIDENT

- An emphasis on Informality . . .
 - His approach to his Inauguration
 Day
 - Visits from Foreign Dignitaries
 - Cabinet Meetings
 - Presidential Dinners
- Believed formality was the means of establishing an aristocracy






- Architect Monticello

POLITICS

- "But every difference of opinion is not a difference of principle.
 We are all republicans we are all federalists."
- First Inaugural Address, 1800



LOUISIANA PURCHASE

- "the less that is said about my constitutional difficulty, the better; and that it will be desirable for Congress to do what is necessary in silence."
- "the good sense of our country will correct the evil of [broad] construction when it shall produce ill effects."



RELIGION

• "The legitimate powers of government extend to such acts as are injurious to others. But it does me no injury for my neighbor to say there are twenty gods or no gods. It neither picks my pocket nor breaks my leg."



TRADITION V. REASON

"This institution [University of Virginia] will be based on the illimitable freedom of the human mind. For here we are not afraid to follow truth wherever it may lead, nor to tolerate any error so long as the reason is left free to combat it."



DEBT

"We may consider each generation as a distinct nation, with a right, by the will of its majority, to bind themselves, but none to bind the succeeding generation, more than the inhabitants of another country."

SLAVERY

"But as it is, we have the wolf by the ear, and we can neither hold him, nor safely let him go. Justice is in one scale, and self-preservation in the other."



SLAVERY

"Indeed I tremble for my country. When I reflect that God is just: that his justice cannot sleep for ever: that considering numbers, nature and natural means only, a revolution of the wheel of fortune, an exchange of situation, is among possible events; that it may become probable by supernatural interference! The Almighty has no attribute which can take sides with us in such a contest."
